Servanthood, not status

Wherever you are as you read this, picture your stage and someone on the floor wrestling with church congregation. If you are reading the online version, this will mean using that amazing mind that God has given you, which enables you to see clearly the faces of people you know, even though they are not with you in person. If you are in our chapel, quietly reading this before the next worship service begins, then you can take a surreptitious look around at those who are there with you. In that case, you might spot others doing the same thing; perhaps your eyes might meet, in which case, what will you do? Will you smile and mouth "Hello" and then look away or will you simultaneously realise both of you are responding to what you are reading now, and enjoy a quick chuckle? Whatever happens, when you picture your brothers and sisters in Christ, what do you see?

In Philippians, chapter two, the apostle Paul writes "In humility, value others above yourselves, not looking to your own interests but each of you to the interests of the others". Or as the songwriter Graham Kendrick puts it in one of his lovely God inspired songs, "Each other's needs to prefer". Paul goes on to emphasise the person and divinity of Jesus, to spell out to us the 'mindset' that is expected of us as Christian believers.

As we picture our church congregation, let's ask God to show us how we can demonstrate this 'mindset' of Jesus to those who are in this congregation with us. Who can you see or who have you brought to mind? Let's go into the building together. There's the person who welcomes at the door and gave us this newsletter. Good strong handshake and a cheerful smile. Perhaps a peck on the cheek. There's a small group of musicians on the front

an octopus of electrical cables. Our pastor is at the lectern checking his sermon. Words and pictures are being projected onto the front wall, so there must be someone on the balcony in charge of that. Some parents have brought in their children, who are playing on the three colourful carpets that someone took time to choose and buy. A few friends are missing, so they are probably upstairs praying before the service starts. Others can be heard clearing up the breakfast things and getting out the refreshment stuff for the fellowship time between the two morning services. The chair of trustees is warming up her flute and one of the associate pastors is getting out his saxophone. Chairs are filling up, a sense of anticipation is in the room as the pastor glances at the clock, which is accurate and ticking because someone has put in a fresh battery. Which of all these people is the most important?

Membership of a church is definitely not about personal status; it is about servanthood. This servanthood is not false modesty: it is about deliberately setting aside any status we happen to possess, because of birth, education, job or anything else. Paul says this is what Jesus did, and so we, as His followers, must do likewise. It's a simple message, yet so hard to put into practice. And it is a message for every one of us, for leaders, for preachers and for those on the coffee rota. This message of mutual submission and care is a common feature of Paul's writings and we need to resist asking "But who will look after my interests if I don't?" The answer from Paul is clear: "Your brothers and sisters in Christ will".
