# These boots were made for walking...

Indulge me for a paragraph if you will, because there was much excitement in the Jones household during the days I had off after Easter. This was in part due to the fact that the limited edition theatrical poster - for the three brand new episodes of the 1960s series Thunderbirds - finally found a place above the stairs in our hallway. It's a glorious sight!

The thing is, however much I'm enjoying the site of my framed Thunderbirds poster every time I head down our stairs, something that has got me genuinely even more excited is the re-emergence in the foyer - between the chapel and the Manna House - of the Prayer Walking tree. This week as I've wandered past it, there's something about it that grabs my attention and I believe gives me a renewed sense of expectation as to what God can do and has in store.

Prayer walking is a great way to get active in prayer and is as simple as it sounds – you pray as you walk. Since last summer we have been praying for our community, street by street. We're not there yet, we're well on the way, but even when we've ticked them all off the list, that's not the end. I believe we need to be constantly praying for our community and systematically, each road, street and lane is a great way for us to do this.

The tree was temporarily moved to the Prayer Room back in December and it would be easy for us to think we've kind of done that and can therefore forget about it. Why do we need to bring it out and make mention of it again? Wasn't it just a bit of gimmick for those who are interested in that sort of thing

and therefore having given it profile for a few months we can leave it there...right?

Personally I'm not convinced.

What is more I believe we need to be praying for our community now more than ever. In a matter of weeks, as a church, we will be joining churches across East Sussex in The Turning. Yinka Oyekan (Turning Team Leader) describes it as 'a gift from heaven, a gift that miraculously empowers ordinary Christians, enabling them to proclaim the gospel of Jesus Christ.' I love that, because on the one hand it lets me off the hook. Its not about what I'm going to do, achieve or accomplish - it's totally about God and His Holy Spirit's power at work. That said, on the other hand I love Yinka's description because it reminds me that this is not something we can limit, or bottle, tame or control - it's totally about God and His Holy Spirit's power at work.

During SportsReach, Sooty one of the coaches, reminded us again of his favourite bible verse. It's found in James 5:16, The prayer of a righteous person is powerful and effective. I long to see the lives of those within this community totally transformed by the power of God.

So can I encourage you next time you're in the foyer, to take a look at the tree, see which streets haven't yet been prayed through and get involved. If you're not sure what to do or where to start, then there's some guidelines next to the Prayer Tree or alternatively just ask. Some streets have been prayed for many times, that's great too. Let us saturate this place in prayer and be ready for what God has to come.
