



Having faith in a faithful God

This year I have started reading the Bible in one year, using Nicky Gumbel's commentary as I go along. So I have found myself re-reading stories in Genesis and Matthew's gospel that I feel I have been familiar with since childhood. And yet there is always something new to reflect on...

I have been struck once again by the strength of Abraham's faith. In Genesis 15, God promises him a son and as many descendants as there are stars, and, although in human terms this prospect seems unlikely, '...Abram believed the Lord, and the Lord counted him as righteous because of his faith' (v6, NLT). Or, 'God declared him "Set-Right-with-God"' (v6, MSG). Gumbel comments, 'The New Testament often refers to this verse because it shows that mercy, forgiveness and righteousness are obtained by faith – that is, believing God'.¹

Abraham was not without fault (Gen 12: 10-20; Gen 16 & 20), but it is encouraging for us to see that he is listed in Hebrews 11 as one of the great people of faith. 'The New Testament suggests that God overlooks the sin of Sarah and Abraham and only remembers their faith.' (Gumbel p 15)

In Matthew's gospel, Jesus commends the faith of several people who seek healing from him: the friends bringing a paralysed man to Jesus ('Seeing their faith...' Matt 9:2); the woman who has suffered from a bleeding condition for twelve years ("Daughter... your faith has made you well."' Matt 9:22); two blind men ("Because of your faith, it will happen."' Matt 9:29). There is also the Roman centurion (Matt 8), who says "Lord, I am not worthy to have you come into my home. Just say the word from

where you are, and my servant will be healed."' He believed that Jesus' word alone was sufficient to heal his servant. 'The centurion recognised that, as in the army, authority comes from being under authority – so Jesus' authority comes from being under the authority of his Father. The centurion saw that when Jesus spoke, God spoke.' (Gumbel, p19)

The attitude of trust and confidence that the Bible calls 'belief' or 'faith' is not something we can obtain without help. Faith is a gift from God (Eph 2:8,9), and growing in faith is a constant process of daily renewing our trust in Jesus. And prayer is the key that unlocks faith in our life, as we rely on God and invite him to shape and guide our lives.

And even then God can throw us a wobbler... In Genesis 22 we see God testing Abraham by commanding him to "take your son, your only son – yes, Isaac, whom you love so much" to be sacrificed as a burnt offering. Abraham obeys. Hebrews 11 tells us that he acted in faith that God would provide a miracle of some kind to spare his son – and he does. God the provider, Jehovah Jireh, gave life. 'He saved the promised son from being a sacrifice. He preserved His promise to make Isaac a great nation... In Genesis, Abraham's only son was set to be sacrificed and was saved by God's miraculous provision. In the gospels, God's only Son was sacrificed as the miraculous provision for all people.'2

Therefore, 'Let us hold unswervingly to the hope that we profess, for he who promised is faithful.' (Hebrews 10:23).


November. We plan to have a Church Weekend together from 18th-20th October. Do save these dates if you can!
