I've remembered Jesus' death and resurrection with people I know really well, and others whom I've only just met. I've celebrated the Lord's supper when the person at the front is speaking a language I personally didn't understand. I've used bread, wafers, crackers, rice cakes, juice, wine, to name but a few of the different items that have been used to symbolise the body and blood of Jesus.

Every time, whether I've realised it or not, it's been a privilege and at its heart has been that remembrance, that celebration and that declaration of who Jesus is and the difference he makes.

Jesus told his disciples, "If anyone would come after me, let him deny himself and take up his cross and follow me. For whoever would save his life will lose it, but whoever loses his life for my sake will find it. For what will it profit a man if he gains the whole world and forfeits his soul? Or what shall a man give in return for his soul?

What a privilege we have to be able to come together as family and to celebrate as one. I can't wait! Jesus welcomes us all to his table, inviting us to take, eat, drink and be transformed! I look forward to seeing you there.

May we gather expectant, to worship the risen King!

**Curry Night:** A table for 15-20 people has been booked at New Spice, Robertsbridge, on Tuesday 6th February at 7pm. Please


