"Sir, we want to see Jesus."

Have you ever had the experience of meeting up with a group of people you haven't seen for years, perhaps at a school reunion or at a wedding or funeral? I can remember being in such a group and scanning across the crowd, thinking I didn't know anyone. Then, gradually we introduced ourselves and as the different ones spoke and I looked more closely, I realised I did know several of them after all. Of course, in this case, the change was largely due to ageing.

Last Sunday, Jenny suggested that, although Easter is over for another year, we should continue thinking around the different parts of the Easter story. My thoughts wandered to the fact that people didn't seem to easily recognise Jesus after the resurrection. Mary met Jesus outside the tomb, yet didn't know Him until He spoke her name (John 20). Of course, she was crying and tears certainly blur your vision. Some have suggested that maybe the sun was rising behind Jesus so His face was in shadow, or was it just that His resurrection body was different in appearance?

Then in Luke 24, we read the amazing account of the two disciples walking to Emmaus, being joined by Jesus and yet not recognising Him, until He prayed and broke bread with them.

As followers of Jesus, presumably they knew Him quite well and had listened to Him teaching, yet here they walked and talked with Him for some distance without knowing who

He was. However, in this case, Luke tells us that 'their eyes were kept from recognising Him', so I guess this must be put down to divine intervention.

In John 21, there is the beach breakfast, where Jesus prepared bread and fish for some of His disciples - not just any disciples, but seven of His closest followers, including the three who were His most intimate friends. Jesus stood on the beach while they were in the boat fishing, but they did not know it was Him. Was it still too dark to recognize Him or was it just that they couldn't believe it could possibly be Him? Or did He just look different? Even when they were all on the beach together, there was obviously still some uncertainty, as verse 12 says, rather cryptically, that none of them dared ask Him, 'Who are You?' because they knew it was the Lord. It seems He was the 'same' but 'different'! As it says in 1 Corinthians 15 v. 53, the mortal had put on immortality.

I wonder how many people 'see' Jesus today, but don't recognise Him. Ed spoke about sharing the good news of Jesus on Sunday. Do people see Jesus in action, but don't always hear about the source of that action from us? Do you remember the Greeks in John 12 who said to Philip, "Sir, we want to see Jesus'? Let's pray that many will see Jesus in our lives and by our words throughout this year and not just at Easter.
