Lines

They are all around us. Some are more obvious than others. There are those hidden in plain sight - perhaps we've stopped noticing they are there at all. We might say some are more serious and rightly elevated and enforced above others: they keep us safe. Whereas many are more light-hearted even fun, therefore we really need not worry about them at all. Others, although they once looked faint and temporary, have long since become hard and seemingly immoveable - written in to the laws of space and time.

Lines are all around us.

I've been asking myself whether this is how God intended life to be? An in/out, us/them be unsettling for you. Where might this lead? Is this the model we see in Jesus? Is this what it means to seek to follow him with all of my life? Is this what obedience to God is all about?

There is that warning I'm sure we've all come about?

Speaking at our Good Friday service I quoted John Mark Comer, who in his book *Practising the Way* says this: "When you sin, don't hide it from God. Hold it before God, with no excuses, no blame shifting, no denial, just utter vulnerability, and let God love you as you are. And then let God love you into who you have the potential to become."

It was the phrase in the middle that I felt led to emphasise, 'Let God love you as you are'. Do we rush on too easily and too quickly into the celebration of Easter Sunday? Perhaps there is a time and a place - and potentially a need - for us to pause and to simply be, resting in God's love. Letting him love us.

The final sentence of the quote from Comer needs to be noticed and reflected on, though.

The whole idea of, 'allowing God to love us into who we have the potential to become'.

In part I think this has something to do with lines. With welcome. With hospitality. With grace. With a willingness to ask questions. With the help of Holy Spirit to seek God's heart and guidance afresh and anew, that we might become people who live lives that speak Jesus in the way we act and interact with those we encounter and come across through all we do.

This Sunday we begin a new series, exploring the radical hospitality of Jesus we see in the Bible, what it looks like and considering what it means for our lives today. I'm aware that the whole idea of even raising this topic and beginning to ask some of these questions may be unsettling for you. Where might this lead? Is there a hidden agenda here? What is actually being suggested?

There is that warning I'm sure we've all come across or heard at some point of 'stranger danger'. Sadly, it is a warning that does have merit in the world today and not just for little children. I do wonder though, has it seeped into our subconscious and therefore into the life of the church in a way that perhaps isn't always so helpful? Has it become something of a starting point? There is a tension here, I see that, in some ways a massive one. But one I would much rather, with God's help, pray into, ask questions over and grapple with, that we might continue to grow and be transformed as his people, here, now and for all he has ahead.
