Problems or opportunities...

On the 31st January, at the church half night of prayer, Brian Mills led us in prayer for four countries that all started with 'I' - Indonesia, Iran, Iraq and Israel; four countries with more than their fair share of problems. But perhaps it is radical Islam that poses what some may see as the biggest threat in these countries at the moment.

We can so often focus on problems and issues in this world. The media constantly want to make us aware of threats to our national security; there is a certain brand of journalism that would have us imagining terrorists or ISIS hiding round every corner. It is clear that certain political stances concerning refugees have emerged from fears about certain people groups.

What we are seeing is a world that is increasingly divided and where suspicion and fear trump compassion and hope. It is a shame that the ***most*** wealthy, the ***most*** secure, the ***most*** privileged, the ***most*** powerful, can be those who turn their back on the ***least*** fortunate because all they can see is the risk to their own circumstances and resources. ***In some ways, the 'powerful' who take these decisions are actually the most insecure of all; the weakest of all.*** With the disappointing decision taken recently by our government to halt the reception of the most vulnerable child refugees to this country under the Dubs amendment, it is clear that our society is no stranger to these attitudes.

Of course, what the media don't tell us about are the amazing ways God's Kingdom is moving in the midst of the colossal changes our world is going through. The Muslims who are finding faith in Jesus Christ, the renewal of previously dying churches in Germany that are being filled with new converts and seeing baptisms every month because of the move of God among refugees; the dozens of house churches being planted in Iraq and the hope demonstrated by Christians there which is amazing even ISIS. Elsewhere, it is thought that the church in Iran is the fastest growing church in the world with millions who have come to faith in Jesus in recent decades.

On the 31st January, Brian asked us what do we see - 'a problem, or an opportunity'. ***Indeed, in any time of change, whether in the world, the church or our personal lives, do we focus on the problems or the opportunities?*** The evil one wants nothing more than to see increasing division and hostility in this world, and for us to either be a part of this expansion of his false and illegitimate kingdom,

or to sit back and do nothing. He wants us to focus on the problems, on all he is doing, and to be trapped by fear, anxiety and worry. He wants to fool Christians into believing that the Kingdom we are a part of is somehow threatened by him and that he is the one who is most powerful in this world. But of course, this is all a deception.

We want to be the people who focus on what God is doing. Who celebrate the ways in which His Kingdom is advancing in this world. Who seek to be a part of this movement. This means remaining true to Christ's teaching and recognising that loving our neighbour means crossing the barriers that others erect, sacrificing our resources, taking the risk, because we recognise Christ in those who are in need. It means feeding the hungry, clothing the naked and sharing the gospel with the poor. ***God's Kingdom is not threatened by those of other cultures who do not yet know him, but it is undermined by Christians who go the way of the world and reject those in need.***

How do we respond? Let's make every effort to show solidarity with those others reject, whatever their background. Let's recognise true humanity in the people that others wish to dehumanise. Let's reach out with Christ's love in whatever small way we can, knowing that our God can use these things in a mighty way.
